LOCAL LAW

BY COUNCIL PRESIDENT COLLINS-BELLAMY, MAJORITY LEADER RUBBO, MAJORITY WHIP NORMAN, MINORITY LEADER BREEN, COUNCILMEMBERS, PINEDA-ISAAC, DIAZ AND MERANTE:

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING PARTS OF ARTICLE IV OF CHAPTER 15 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF YONKERS ENTITLED "SALES AND USE TAX" TO CONFORM TO THE 2025 AMENDMENTS OF THE NEW YORK STATE TAX LAW.

BE IT ENACTED, by the City Council of the City of Yonkers, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 15 of the Code of the City of Yonkers entitled "Taxes" is hereby amended in part, by amending a portion of Section 15-42 thereof, entitled "Imposition of sales tax" to read as follows:

§ 15-42. Imposition of sales tax.

On and after January 1, 1976, there is hereby imposed and shall be paid an additional tax at the rate of one (1) percent additional to the three (3) percent rate authorized by section 1210 of the New York State Tax Law, and for the period beginning September 1, 2015, and ending November 30, 2025 2027, there is hereby imposed and shall be paid an additional tax at the rate of one-half (0.5) percent additional to such three (3) percent rate and such additional one (1) percent rate, upon: ...

Section 2. Chapter 15 of the Code of the City of Yonkers entitled "Taxes" is hereby amended in part, by amending Section 15-43 thereof, entitled "Transitional provisions" by amending subdivision "H" to read as follows:

§ 15-43. Transitional provisions.

H. With respect to the additional tax of one-half (0.5) percent imposed for the period beginning September 1, 2015, and ending November 30, 2025 2027, the provisions of Subsections A, B, C, D and E of this section apply, except that for the purposes of this subsection, all references in said Subsections A, B, C and D to June 1, 1968, and January 1, 1976, shall be read as referring to September 1, 2015; all references in said Subsection A to February 1, 1968, shall be read as referring to May 1, 2015; all references to September 1, 1975, shall be read as referring to May 1, 2015; and the reference in said Subsection B to May 31, 1968, or December 31, 1975, shall be read as referring to August 31, 1975. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to exempt from the tax, at the rates in effect prior to September 1, 2015, any transactions which may not be subject to the additional tax

imposed on that date.

Section 3. Chapter 15 of the Code of the City of Yonkers entitled "Taxes" is hereby amended in part, by amending Section 15-44 thereof, entitled "Imposition of compensating use tax" to read as follows:

§ 15-44. Imposition of compensating use tax.

Except to the extent that property or services have already been or will be subject to the sales tax under this article, there is hereby imposed on every person a use tax for the use within this City on and after August 1, 1965, except as otherwise exempted under this article:

- A. Of any tangible personal property purchased at retail.
- B. Of any tangible personal property manufactured, processed or assembled by the user if items of the same kind of tangible personal property are offered for sale by him in the regular course of business.
 - C. Of any of the services described in § 15-42C(1).
- D. Of any tangible personal property, however acquired, where not acquired for purposes of resale upon which any of the services described under § 15-42C(2) and (3) have been performed. For purposes of Subsection A of this section, the tax shall be at the rate of 3%, and effective January 1, 1976, an additional tax at the rate of 1% additional to such 3% rate, and effective for the period beginning September 1, 2015, and ending November 30, 2025 2027, an additional tax at the rate of 0.5% additional to such 3% rate and such additional 1% rate of the consideration given or contracted to be given for such property, or for the use of such property, but excluding any credit for tangible personal property accepted in partial payment and intended for resale, plus the cost of transportation, except that where such cost is separately stated in the written contract, if any, and on the bill rendered to the purchaser. For purposes of Subsection B of this section, the tax shall be at the rate of 3% and effective January 1, 1976, an additional tax at the rate of 1% additional to such 3% rate, and effective for the period beginning September 1, 2015, and ending November 30, 2025 2027, an additional tax at the rate of 0.5% additional to such 3% rate and such additional 1% rate, of the price at which items of the same kind of tangible personal property are offered for sale by the user, and the mere storage, keeping, retention or withdrawal from storage of tangible personal property by the person who manufactured, processed or assembled such property shall not be deemed a taxable use by him. Notwithstanding the foregoing, or the purposes of Subsection B of this section, there shall be no tax on any portion of such price which represents the value added by the user to tangible personal property which he fabricates and installs to the specifications of an addition or capital improvement to real property, property or land, as the terms "real property," "property" or "land" are defined in the Real Property Tax Law, over and above the prevailing normal purchase price prior to such fabrication of such tangible personal property which a manufacturer, producer or assembler would charge an unrelated contractor who similarly fabricated and installed such tangible personal property to the

specifications of an addition or capital improvement to such real property, property or land. For purposes of Subsections C and D of this section, the tax shall be at the rate of 3%, and effective January 1, 1976, an additional tax at the rate of 1% additional to such 3% rate, and effective for the period beginning September 1, 2015, and ending November 30, 2025 2027, an additional tax at the rate of 0.5% additional to such 3% rate and such additional 1% rate of the consideration given or contracted to be given for the service, including the consideration for any tangible personal property transferred in conjunction with the performance of the service, plus the cost of transportation of property so transferred and of the tangible personal property upon which the service was performed, except where such cost is separately stated in the written contract, if any, and on the bill rendered to the purchaser.

Section 4. Chapter 15 of the Code of the City of Yonkers entitled "Taxes" is hereby amended in part, by amending Section 15-51 thereof, entitled "Exemptions from use tax," by amending subdivision A thereof to read as follows:

§ 15-51 Exemptions from use tax.

A. In respect to the use of property used by the purchaser in this City prior to June 1, 1968; and with respect to the additional tax at the rate of 0.5% imposed for the period beginning September 1, 2015, and ending November 30, 2025 2027, in respect to the use of property used by the purchaser in the City prior to September 1, 2015.

Section 5. This local law shall take effect on September 1, 2025 and in accordance with law.

The proposed amendment to the City Code will extend the existence of the additional .05% Sales Tax until November 30, 2027.

This City Code amendment is to match the extension of existing taxes by as passed by the State Legislature to November 30, 2027.

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING SECTION 15-141 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF YONKERS, IN RELATION TO EXTENDING THE CITY OF YONKERS MORTGAGE RECORDING TAX TO CONFORM TO THE 2025 AMENDMENTS OF THE NEW YORK STATE TAX LAW.

BE IT ENACTED, by the City Council of the City of Yonkers, as follows:

Section 1.Section 15-141 of Article XIII of Chapter 15 of the Code of the City of Yonkers, as amended, is hereby further amended as follows:

Section 15-141. Imposition of tax.

A tax of \$0.50 for each \$100 and each remaining major fraction thereof of principal debt or obligation which is, or under any contingency may be secured at the date of execution thereof or at any time thereafter by a mortgage on real property situated within the city and recorded on or after September 1, 1993, or prior to September 1, 2025 2027, is hereby imposed on each such mortgage and shall be collected and paid as provided in this article. If the principal debt or obligation which is or by any contingency may be secured by such mortgage is less than \$100, a tax of \$0.50 is hereby imposed on such mortgage, and shall be collected and paid as provided in this article.

Section 2. This local law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State and in accordance with law.

BE IT ENACTED, by the City Council of the City of Yonkers, as follows:

Section 1.Paragraph A of Section 15-100 of Article IX of Chapter 15 of the Codes and Ordinances of the City of Yonkers, as amended, is hereby further amended as follows:

Section 15-100. Persons subject to tax surcharge.

- A. General. The City of Yonkers income tax surcharge imposed hereby shall be imposed for each taxable year on every City resident individual, estate and trust in every taxable year commencing after December 31, 1983, and ending on or before December 31, 2025 2027. A taxpayer's taxable year for the purposes of the City of Yonkers income tax surcharge imposed pursuant to this article shall be the same as his/her taxable year under Article 22 of the New York State Tax Law.
- Section 2. Section 15-117 of Article X of Chapter 15 of the Codes and ordinances of the City of Yonkers, as amended, is hereby further amended as follows:

Section 15-117. Taxable years to which tax is imposed.

The tax imposed by this article is imposed for taxable years beginning December 31, 1983, and ending on or before December 31, 2025 2027.

Section 3. This local law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State and in accordance with law.

A SPECIAL ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF THE SUMMER YOUTH EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM GRANT FROM THE WESTCHESTER COUNTY YOUTH BUREAU IN THE AMOUNT OF \$16,667.67 AND AMENDING THE CITY OF YONKERS GRANT BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025-2026

The City of Yonkers hereby ordains and enacts:

Section 1: The Westchester County Youth Bureau has awarded a grant of \$16,667.67 the Yonkers Youth Bureau, acting by and through the City of Yonkers Department of Parks, Recreation and Conservation (the "City"), for the Summer Youth Employment Program Grant.

Section 2: The City is not required to provide a matching share.

Section 3: The above constitutes a "Type II" action under SEQRA and its implementing regulations, 6 NYCRR Part **617**, which constitute an action determined not to have a significant effect on the environment and therefore requiring no further environmental review.

Section 4: The Mayor of the City or his authorized designee is hereby empowered to execute any and all instruments and take such other actions as may be necessary to effectuate the purposes hereof.

Section 5: The City's Grant Budget for fiscal year 2025-26 is hereby amended by increasing revenues and appropriations for the Department of Parks, Recreation, and Conservation, as follows:

INTRODUCER'S MEMORANDUM SUBMITTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION §C4-6 OF THE CHARTER

SPONSOR: Yonkers Department of Parks and Recreation (Yonkers Youth Bureau)

TITLE OF BILL:

A SPECIAL ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF THE SUMMER YOUTH EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM GRANT FROM THE WESTCHESTER COUNTY YOUTH BUREAU IN THE AMOUNT OF \$16,667.67 AND AMENDING THE CITY OF YONKERS GRANT BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2026

PURPOSE: Amend the grant budget to accept the grant funding.
